Limitations Of Static Web Pages

- There are a number of limitations of static web pages. These include:
 - It can be difficult to maintain consistent information across the different web pages on your site.
 - It can be more difficult to update information on a web site.
 - Some information you wish to publish may be dynamic(eg stock prices).
 - You may wish to give different users a different view on the same web pages.

ASP, JSP and PHP

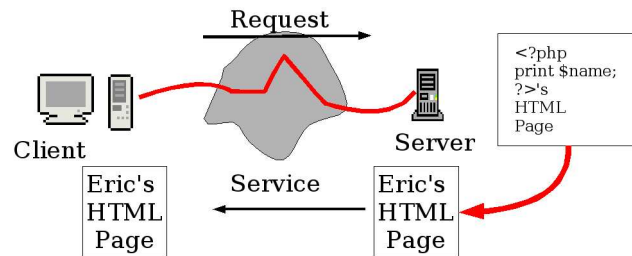

- The commonly used approaches that provide dynamic pages are:
 - Microsoft's Active Server Pages (ASP),
 - Java Server Pages(JSP), or
 - PHP.

Getting the Server Working!

- The server does most of the work in executing code to generate the content which is sent via HTTP like static content.
- Remember the web is a 'pull' technology.



PHP Time Example

- The PHP file on the server contains the following:

```
<p> The current time is <?php print date("h:i:s A"); ?> </p>
```
- When the HTTP request comes the web server 'executes' the php file to generate the HTML.

```
<p> The current time is 9:30:31 PM </p>
```
- This HTML is then sent back to the web browser.

Making Pages Consistent

- PHP provides a powerful and flexible way of keeping information consistent on web pages.

```
<?php $hod = "Tom"; ?>
:
<p> The current head is <?php print $hod ?>. </p>
<p> <?php print $hod; ?> works hard to keep everyone happy! </p>
```



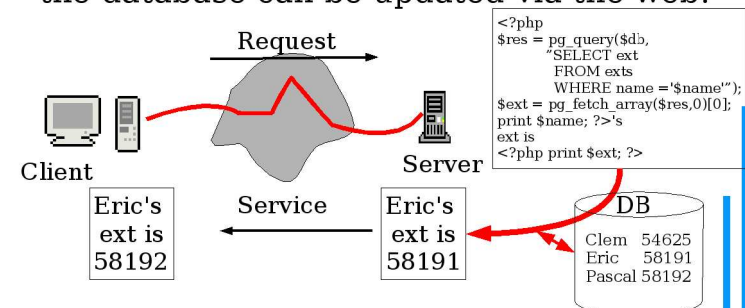
The current head is Tom.

Tom works hard to keep everyone happy!

Connecting to a DB

- PHP (and JSP, ASP) provide simple interfaces to connect to database systems. This enables web pages to be created using information taken out of the database. Also the database can be updated via the web.



- A DataBase is a program that stores a set of tables. DataBase's have standard ways of get information out of the database and put information back into it.
- DataBase's are designed to be efficient and robust.
- MySQL and Postgres are databases that are commonly used to connect to web servers.
- SQL is a commonly used languages to talk to a database with. (commands like select, delete and update,)

- This php page generates a phone list from a database.

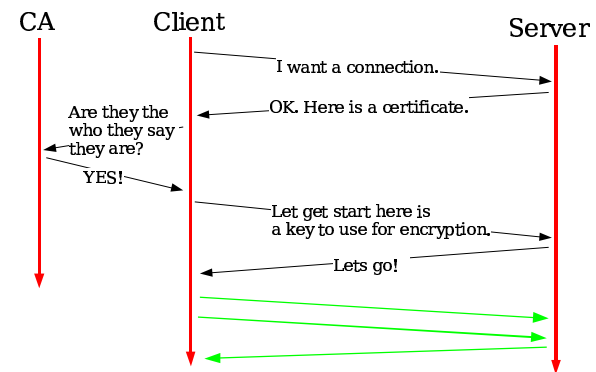

- Secure Sockets Layer(SSL) a secure way of authentication of the server(and client). It also encrypts the data between the client and the server. This stops a third party viewing this information.
- The protocol part of the URL is 'https' when SSL is used.
- SSL uses a trusted third part to certify the identity of the server. (CAs certification authorities)

- SSL uses public key encryption to set up the connection.



SSL

- There can be problems if a name server has been compromised.
- Often people will accept any old certification authorities.
- Also SSL will not tell you if the business at the other end of the interaction is any good. Moreover, it does not help in terms of the business knowing if you should be using the credit card or not!

Passwords and Encryption

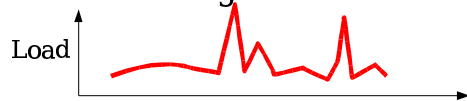

- Passwords provide the simplest and most common way of authenticating a user.
- Encryption provides a way of keeping information secret even when a third part views the information along the way.
- RSA(public key encryption) and DES are two commonly used encryption standards.

Scaling Up or Scaling Out

- The more complexity placed on a server the slower it will work. Moreover, the server will have difficulty handling a large number of requests.
- Note that, the demand peeks on servers on the internet can be large.



- One approach to this problem is using solutions that scale up(make servers faster and more efficient). Another approach is to scale out(duplicate the inefficient approach)
